-2 Corinthians 5:17-19 NASB

When a new year rolls around oftentimes people will come up with New Year’s resolutions. They set goals they want to meet or things they want to improve about themselves in the new year. Common resolutions are wanting to lose weight or desiring to learn a new skill or hobby. The resolutions people choose range from the mundane to the grand such as wanting to be more kind or patient in the coming year.

Why do people like to make New Year’s resolutions in the first place? Well, the new year serves as a benchmark, a perceived opportunity for a fresh start or a new change. People often think, “Maybe this year things will be different.” New Year’s resolutions are perfectly fine, but the truth is we don’t have to wait for a new year or some benchmark to make a new start. We have that opportunity every day.

This truth points us to a greater reality in regard to our relationship with God. Many times believers think their justification and reconciliation with God was an event that occurred in the past at their baptism or when they first came to faith in Christ. This is most certainly true. But God doesn’t tie our salvation to a single time and place in our lives. He is far too generous for that.

One of my favorite articles in our Lutheran Confessions contained within the Book of Concord comes from Martin Luther’s Smalcald Articles Part III, Article IV: Of the Gospel where Luther states that God is superabundantly rich in his grace for he grants forgiveness to us through his preached word, in baptism and the Lord’s Supper, through confession and absolution, and mutual conversation and consolation of the brethren (Matt 18:20). And the first of Luther’s 95 Theses states that the whole life of a Christian is one of repentance.

Luther was saying that we can be renewed and reconciled to God every day. We don’t have to wait for a new year. We don’t have to “get right with God,” as if we could reconcile ourselves to him through personal effort. God grants us his grace and mercy, even his own Spirit, every moment of our lives. I am writing this on Christmas Day, 2020. And I do not have to wait until January 1 to start again and be renewed in God’s grace. Because we are in Him every day we are renewed in His grace, and every day is an opportunity to be renewed in personal holiness and piety. We were made a new creation in him. We are being made new. And we will be finally made new in the day of Christ Jesus. Amen.
