PATIENCE

“The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance.”

–2 Peter 3:9

Our Blessed Lord Jesus has promised that He shall return. Throughout history every generation of Christians, even the apostles themselves, thought that Jesus would return in their lifetime. They were not wrong to think this way. Jesus himself has told us to watch and always be ready for His return. We do not think about His return as some far-off event, but we look for His coming even today. We do not know the day or hour, but we have faith in His promise.

However, we see that Jesus did not return in the days of the apostles, nor has He returned yet today. When we think about the span of time that has passed since the time of Jesus it is easy to become impatient. As Peter writes in chapter 3 and verse 4, for some this impatience turns to unbelief. They say, “Where is the promise of His coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all continues just as it was from the beginning of creation.” They see the passage of time as evidence that Jesus will not return.

God gives us the reason for His apparent delay. Christ has not yet returned because He is patient with us. He has given us time for repentance and faith. Let us not begrudge others the same. Our patience must endure until Christ returns. We faithfully wait for Him because Jesus is always faithful to fulfill his promises.

We are called to have patience. Patience is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. You might describe patience as “waiting faithfully.” This fruit of the spirit applies to every area of our lives. If we grow weary of waiting we have missed the purpose of patience. If we “patiently” wait until we become annoyed or fed up, we are not patient. The patient person does not get to decide when they’ve had enough, when their patience has run out. Patience must endure until what we are waiting for arrives. Otherwise it is not patience at all. We certainly anticipate and look forward to the arrival or the reprieve we are waiting for, but we wait with patience, having faith that we will receive the fulfillment of the promise or the final reward.
