

Our Confession

May Your lovingkindnesses also come to me, O Lord, Your salvation according to Your word; So I will have an answer for him who reproaches me, For I trust in Your word. And do not take the word of truth utterly out of my mouth, For I wait for Your ordinances. So I will keep Your law continually,

Forever and ever. And I will walk at liberty, For I seek Your precepts. I will also speak of Your testimonies before kings And shall not be ashamed. I shall delight in Your commandments, Which I love. And I shall lift up my hands to Your commandments, Which I love; And I will meditate on Your statutes.

-Psalm 119:41-48

Martin Luther had stirred a very big pot. According to the Scriptures Luther preached salvation through faith in Jesus Christ alone. He stood on this truth against the corruption of the Roman church and confessed the faith before the emperor at the Diet of Worms in 1521. As a result Luther became a fugitive and went into hiding. But Luther's teaching was the teaching of Scripture. Because Luther illuminated the Scriptures many people came to believe in the pure gospel of Jesus Christ including many princes and electors in the land.

In 1530 many of these princes met before the emperor at the Diet of Augsburg where they presented their confession. The Augsburg Confession contained a summary of their faith. It answered questions such as: who is God? What is sin? Who is Jesus? And how are we saved? The confession then moved to the office of the holy ministry, the church, the Sacraments, and concluded with various other important topics.

One of Luther's strongest opponents, Johann Eck, led a confutation (or rebuttal) of the Confession which many on both sides saw as somewhat of an embarrassment. However, the confutation gave opportunity for Philip Melanchthon, the lead writer of the Confession, to write an apology (or defense). This Apology allowed the evangelical Christians (labeled Lutherans) to explain their faith in even greater detail.

As Lutherans, and especially as Christians, it is very important to know what we believe, to answer to the basic questions of our faith. We don't have to start this work from scratch. The faithful men of the Diet of Augsburg have succinctly summarized the faith for us. The faith of the Augsburg Confession is the faith taught in the Bible, and God's word does not change. May God give us the knowledge and strength of faith, not only to believe and live out our confession, but to be ready to give an answer for the hope that it in us before an erring and unbelieving world, even as the Augsburg confessors did those 491 years ago.

NIGEL BROWN: Lord, be with Nigel as he completes his seminary studies.


FOR OUR CONGREGATION: Father, we ask your merciful goodness in providing us with the wisdom, discernment and courage to do Your will.


