August 10th is the feast day of St. Lawrence. St. Lawrence was a deacon of the church in Rome in the mid-200s. At that time the Roman emperor, Valerian, began persecuting Christians in earnest. Valerian demanded that Christians should renounce their faith and offer worship to the Roman gods, or else their property may be seized, they may be banished, or even killed. Many Christians stood firm against this persecution. They refused to worship false gods. True to the emperor's order, many Christians were killed, including Pope Sixtus II.

Eventually the Roman prefect ordered Deacon Lawrence to appear before him and turn over the riches of the church to the Roman authorities. The story goes that Lawrence asked for three days which he used to distribute the church's monies and goods to the poor. Finally, St. Lawrence appeared before the prefect with nothing to turn over. The prefect asked him, "Where are the riches of the church?" St. Lawrence replied that the church is far richer than even the emperor. Even the meek and the poor themselves are the riches of the church.

There are different accounts and legends of St. Lawrence's execution. One legend has it that St. Lawrence was roasted over a fire on a gridiron. During this grave torture the legend says he said, "Turn me over for I am done on this side." For this reason the Catholic Church rather morbidly holds St. Lawrence as the patron saint of chefs and comedians. However, it is more likely that St. Lawrence was beheaded according to the emperor's order.

Indeed, according to St. Lawrence's words, the church is far richer than the richest emperor because of the blessings of God in Christ. The church and all her saints hold the treasures of forgiveness, salvation, and eternal life. And each saint of the church down to the poorest is a precious treasure to God. We are all poor beggars before God, and we receive from him as the poor of Rome received from God by the hand of St. Lawrence. And like Lawrence we all have the opportunity to serve God by serving one another in love and generosity. God has blessed us each in so many ways. Let us follow the example of St. Lawrence in this generosity as well as in perseverance of faith even unto the end.

FOR OUR CHILDREN: Lord, keep each of them strong in You each day. Protect them and guide them in the plan that You have for each of them.


FOR OUR PASTORS: By the power and presence of the Holy Spirit, please uphold and help them stand firm in the truth of Your gracious word.


