

What Can I Do?

With all prayer and petition pray at all times in the Spirit, and with this in view, be on the alert with all perseverance and petition for all the saints, and pray on my behalf, that utterance may be given to me in the opening of my mouth, to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in proclaiming it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak. – Ephesians 6:10–20

In our lives we also face many challenges. On the world stage we continue to suffer the effects of the pandemic. We face news from the situation in Afghanistan and we feel the shockwaves of that conflict on our shores and in our communities. But even on the seemingly smaller stage of our everyday lives we struggle with loved ones who will not believe God's word. We face ill health that prevents us from doing what we love or even leaves us hospitalized or immobilized. Faced with such great troubles we often wonder, "What can I DO?" What can we do in the face of such seemingly insurmountable obstacles?

But instead of asking, "What can I DO?" in despair, by God's grace we can ask, "What CAN I do?" Paul was in dire straits when he wrote his letter to the Ephesians. He was in prison. But even in that situation he asked for the people's prayers so that he would be bold to preach the gospel of Jesus. In prison there wasn't much that Paul could do. He could write, or dictate, at least. He could speak to those who came to him, even preach to them. And he could pray. Even in chains Paul did not lose faith, but he did what he could for the sake of Christ and His church.

Paul's words in the passage above follow his famous passage about the armor of God, the defenses God has granted us against evil and the only weapon we have: God's word. But in the passage above Paul describes our battlefield. Our battlefield is prayer. Prayer is a great gift. In the face of our obstacles, whether we are healthy or ill, we can pray to God. We can pray for one another. Our world seems to despise prayer more and more as if it were nothing, but we know its power. Prayer is powerful because God hears us. And God hears us because He loves us. So let us pray without ceasing in all situations. Let us pray for our world, our loved ones, and ourselves. And let us not despair, but have faith, hope, and peace through the one who hears our prayers, even Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. *—Pastor Abraham McNally*

FOR OUR CONGREGATION: Father, we ask your merciful goodness in providing us with the wisdom, discernment and courage to do Your will.


FOR OUR CHILDREN: Lord, keep each of them strong in You each day. Protect them and guide them in the plan that You have for each of them.


